- Female genital mutilation




Workplace Equality

Women in Criminal Justice System

- Sexism and Racism combined mean women of color are one of the fastest growing segments of the prison populations
- Between 1980 and 2017, the number of incarcerated women increased by more than 750%, rising from a total of 26,378 in 1980 to 225,060 in 2017.



Convention to End Discrimination against Women (CEDAW)

- An international treaty of the United Nations in 1979 and adopted around the world
- United States is the only developed country not to ratify it since 1979

Time to Celebrate: Women in Congress

- In 2020, 127 (105D, 22R) women hold seats in the United States Congress, comprising 23.7% of the 535 members;
