Creator of Material Biography: Lilliana Owens, SL, was born May 13, 1899 in St. Paul, Kansas to James J. Owens and Lillian M. Abell. She was christened Eleanor Elizabeth Owens and took the religious name Lilliana (in honor of her mother) upon being received into the Sisters of Loretto on December 8, 1917. Her older sister, Ethelbert Owens, SL, was also a member of the order, as were two of her aunts, Oswald Abell, SL, and Louis Abell, SL. Lilliana received her bachelor's degree from Loretto Heights University in Denver, Colorado in 1924, her master's from St. Louis University in 1928, and her Ph.D. from St. Louis University in 1935. She taught history, Latin, and religion for more than three decades in high schools across the country, including in Missouri, Colorado, Illinois, Texas, and New Mexico. She later served as the librarian at Loretto Academy in El Paso, Texas and earned a master's in library science from Our Lady of the Lake College in San Antonio, Texas in 1954. Throughout her career, Lilliana was a prolific writer. In all, she published five books, nearly 100 articles in various periodicals, and several monographs, pamphlets, and comic books about Loretto history. She served as an associate editor for *Revista Catolica*, a Spanish-language Catholic newspaper and printing press run by Jesuits in El Paso. Three of Lilliana's books and several of her articles were published by *Revista Catolica*. In 1955, Lilliana moved to the Lafavette Retirement Center in St. Louis to research and write full time. She moved to the Loretto Motherhouse Infirmary in 1984 and died on September 27, 1992.

<u>Description</u>: Series consists of material created by, collected by, or about Lilliana Owens. Includes Owen's family history documents, photographs, correspondence, scrapbooks, and drafts of published work.
